Such a designation or lack thereof may be overturned only by a vote of voting members, i.e. freelancers.
- ci) At branch level, the positions of chair and treasurer shall be filled only by voting members.
- cii) Salaried members shall not be allowed to vote on freelance rates.

Passed, 2 abstentions.

MOVED (Greg Ioannou / Barb Czarnecki) to appoint Robert Shortly as auditor for next year's books.

Carried unanimously.

3c. Fairley Award John Eerkes reported 13 submissions, four more than last year. Judging is underway. The panel of judges is made up of Käthe Roth (QAC Chair), Kathryn Dean (1991 winner), and Denise Schon (Vice-President, Maxwell MacMillan). Presentation of the award will be at the awards banquet of the Canadian Booksellers Association (CBA) in July.

4. Motion to develop a Membership List

MOVED (Shaun Oakey / Riça Night) that the membership committee be empowered to develop a proposal for a membership list of members willing to be included, and to be distributed to all members; and that the committee bring the proposal back to the executive for approval.

Passed, 73 in favour, 5 opposed, 1 abstention.

During the discussion, the following amendment was proposed:

Passed, 72 in favour, 6 opposed, 1 abstention.

MOVED (Ruth Chernia / Phillipa Rispin) to show a vote of appreciation to John Eerkes, his committee (in particular, Elizabeth Reid), and to all the participants in the various Branches who discussed the motion.

Carried unanimously.

6. Elections Heather Ebbs read the names of the candidates put forth by the Nominating Committee. She called three times for further nominations from the floor. In the absence of any further nominations, she declared the following slate of candidates elected by acclamation to the national executive and standing committees:
