## **Conference 2011**

The Indexing Society of Canada approached EAC with a proposal to jointly host next year's conference. The cross-promotion opportunities are obvious, and EAC members would benefit significantly, so the Society's offer was accepted in principle with EAC to be the lead. ## **Volunteer Training**

We talked about the possibility of developing a training program to foster leadership skills, through a handbook or pre-conference sessions. Current needs and resources will be reviewed to make sure we give as much support as possible. EAC owes its success to its volunteers and we want to facilitate their efforts however possible.

## **Contract Collective**

EAC's Contract Collective has seen some real success recently. We have submitted five bids and have been successful in three. To improve our chances with future bids, building a group of volunteers trained in bid preparations is important. To that end, we will work towards facilitating this training. Bid leaders are not paid for their work; instead, they receive a percentage of the total contract amount as a commission if the contract is won. #### **Strategic Planning**

Next year a new plan will be initiated. In the meantime, the goals identified in the existing plan that the NEC expects to see developed over the coming months are as follows:

- *Branch and twig formation*—NEC meetings held in twig cities (Barrie in September, Calgary in November) and VP visiting twig groups to answer questions and help them get started
- *Training and Development*—activating the committee and finding a chair in the next 12 months
- Tom Fairley Award endowment fundraising—Seeking sponsors
- *Facilitating info sharing between branch committee and national committee*—Yes, but not sure what to do about it yet.

- *Partnership opportunities*—Carolyn L Burke is working on it, as is the francophone affairs committee
- *Supporting francophones*—Yes, but not sure how
- Website—EAC seeking co-chair
- *Marketing and PR*—New marketing plans approved and will be implemented by committee and office staff
- Member services brochure and new marketing materials—In progress

### Certification

Finally, there was much discussion of certification maintenance (CM), both on the recommendations from the certification maintenance committee and on the process that led to the document being posted on the website. The committee has done an outstanding, carefully thought-out job, and we thanked them for their efforts. The NEC supports certification maintenance, but we were concerned the program as proposed may be too onerous and bureaucratic to maintain. Unfortunately, there was not enough time to iron out revisions to CM before the certification tests this year. So, we regretfully put the CM program on hold. We hope to work with the CSC after the business of this year's tests has subsided to develop a program that will benefit certified members, the certification program and the association.

### **Next Meeting**

Our next meeting will be in Calgary, November 20–21, when we will set the association's budget for next year. Committees have been busy over the past months working out their particular budget needs. The NEC will be tasked with assessing everyone's needs and trying to allocate resources as efficiently as possible. We'll let you know how it turns out in our next report.
