- 1. It is the only Canadian company that has the technical capacity to handle such book publishing projects.
- a) It is designed for publishing books.
- b) Its clientele is connected to the book industry (which increases the likelihood of reaching donors).
- c) It is cheaper to use than other crowdfunding sites.
- d) It carries much less risk for Editors Canada than other crowdfunding sites.
- o Other crowdfunding sites would require us to meet our goal (if we don't, the money is returned to the donors).
- 2. The association bylaw does not preclude directors receiving compensation for non-director activities.

"7.01 Non-remuneration

Directors shall not be remunerated for their duties as directors or officers. Directors may be reimbursed for reasonable expenses incurred while performing such duties. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to preclude any Executive Council member from serving the Association in any other capacity and receiving compensation for so doing."

3. The association's Conflict of Interest Policy allows for it.

The policy states that "Conflict of interest exists where the activities of association members advance their own interests (or the interests of others with whom they have a familial, personal or business relationship) in a way that may be detrimental or potentially harmful to the normal operations, integrity or aims and objectives of the association."

In the case of the dictionary, advancing the interests of PubLaunch, and the member who owns it, is not harmful to the association (and, in fact, using the company will contribute to the aims and objectives of the association, and has the potential to bring a profit to Editors Canada).

Directors and branch executive members do sometimes get paid for providing a service to members that they have a specialization in, such as seminars or webinars.

4. The member who is part owner of PubLaunch will donate his portion of after-cost profits to Editors Canada, so the member will not make money from the project.
